As the Prime Minister for Taroona primary school it is also important for me to recognize the things that the teachers do to help the students and to help students realize the opportunities available to them.




WHAT'S MORE IMPORTANT; PARTICIPATION OR THE RECOGNITION OF CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE?
